218460 Scott \#10f variety, Facit 9IIv1C4a Carmine [40 pen ROULETTE IV, STAMP TYPE II] Used with VF + appearance and nearly FULL TEETH; only a couple of tooth tips missing. Examples of Roulette IV are rare; examples with completely perfect teeth may not be known (Finnish expert Kaj Hellman once commented that this example may be the nicest in existence): Facit prices full teeth, but Norma does not. However, this example is STAMP TYPE II (cut in right side of bottom of crown; see Facit) which makes it a major rarity; both Facit and Norma indicate that the price of a Stamp Type II example (of even the most common roulette) should be tripled! In addition to the overall excellent quality, it has a full NYSLOTT June 1867 cancellation. Accompanied by a 1991 Mikko Ossa certificate stating, in his typical extremely strict and blunt fashion, that "The stamp has short teeth and some teeth have breaks [i.e. creases on teeth]. The stamp is not repaired." However, it is obvious from the appearance of the stamp that the quality is much nicer than that description suggests. The stamp was in the "Michigan" collection built by an American who lived in Finland in the 1950s-60s; he obtained many of his stamps from such eminent Finnish philatelists as E.A. Hellman. I acquired the stamp in 1991 and have since sold it twice and then repurchased the entire collections of the clients to whom I sold it. Also accompanied by a 2006 Jay Smith photo certificate with lifetime guarantee.

Attractive centering, neat HELSINGFORS and pen-cross cancellations, and only two teeth partially missing.

236692 8a [1866 10 penni Roulette II, ordinary paper] Used F-VF+ with just a couple of the usual tooth problems. Wonderful, sharp and well-centered, JAKOBSTAD "arc" style 14 July 1875 cancellation. Scarce so attractive!

Single stamps of this quality are quite scarce; the surviving blocks are extremely scarce as they are too often broken up for the singles. The single stamps would each fetch $\$ 225$. Facit 2015 value for a NH block with normal centering is $\$ 1050$. Outstanding example!

23831527 [1882 10 penni brown 4-Numerals, perf 12.5] Used Superb with large top and bottom margins and jumbo side margins. Unusually light and neat corner cancellation. The lower right perf tip is just lightly thinned, but mentioned only for absolute accuracy. Interesting plate variety listed in Facit 1974-75 (a large Facit edition that included such varieties) as variety Kv4 (with $50 \%$ value premium): "Lower left value circle has a large break in the top" and also with "Both upper value circles have thickening at bottom right" which is not mentioned in the catalog. Even without the varieties, a beautiful stamp in the 99.5th percentile of quality for this stamp -- rare so nice!

Even more exceptional, the STAMP HAS NOT BEEN SOAKED and has some envelope remains on the reverse, thus the aniline (water soluble!) color appears exactly as it was originally printed. It is rare to find used examples of the aniline colors that have never been changed by soaking. A wonderful example that is much more significant than it first appears.

Facit 2012 value for the least costly printing in usual quality (which is not this nice!) is SEK $225=$ US $\$ 34$ for singles and SEK $1000=$ US $\$ 150$ for 4-block, not counting the value of the major variety. Wonderfully fresh with bright color! Existing blocks of this issue are quickly being broken up and are much harder to find now than just a few years ago. Superior quality, with a scarce variety.

23672334 [1885 25 penni Ultramarine 4-Numeral] Used VF with VF + EKENAS "FINLAND style" 3 May 189[?] cancellation. Unusually attractive. Well centered examples of this cancellation style are scarce on single stamps.

23753743 [1890 1 mark 3-Numeral] Used Superb with nearly complete carved "grid" cancellation. I have not looked up the location. Very attractive.

23200856 [1891 1 rubel Russian Design with Rings] Used VF + with neat ÅBO / TURKU 1904 tri-lingual postmark. Very attractive.

The top perforation row was double-perforated in such a way that the perforation teeth are almost all gone. This issue was perforated with a comb device that was repeatedly struck on the sheet, a row at a time. The row of stamps above this one would have been similarly doubly perforated at the sides. Though one must be cautious about high prices sometimes asked for these types of varieties, this one has every indication of being completely genuine. I guarantee this item to be genuine.

[1882 25 penni 4 Numeral, Perf 12.5] Mint with F-VF+ centering, but with minor, natural bend that is probably the result of the very thick gum that was used in this printing. The gum appears to be original, but is of quite unusual. It is thick, yellowish, and fairly well "dried out". The Handbook states of the early printings of this stamp: "Little is known about the gum. It is mainly colorless or slightly Yellowish. In 1882 thick Brownish gum was used, or it may be that it possibly turned Brownish with time." ## WWII-Era Foreign Volunteers

In the WWII era, during the "Winter War" and the "Continuation War", many foreign volunteers joined the Finnish fight against Russia. The bulk of foreign volunteers fighting in Finland were Swedish. At times, German Nazi forces were also fighting alongside Finnish and volunteer forces, against Russians, resulting in the odd possibility that Jewish Finnish or volunteer officers could be commanding German Nazi soldiers.

Mail from Swedish volunteers can often be identified by postmarks and handstamps that include "F" and/or return addresses of "Haparanda F" and/or "S.F.K." postmarks. Markings using the Swedish-language term "fältpost" indicate Swed-ish-language units, senders, etc., however they do not guarantee that the item is volunteer mail. The Finnish-language term "kenttäpostia" is also (less often) seen on volunteer mail.

## Personalized Stamps - Private Designs

The stamps of Scott \#111-118 have exceptional quality criteria and descriptions due to their method of production. Produced under difficult war-time conditions, the centering varies wildly and often the paper is smaller than the stamp design, thus margins all around are often not possible. Perforations naturally range from clean to very rough. The paper ranges greatly from yellowish/ rough to white/crisp. Some denominations are usually more poorly centered than others.

## Booklet Panes

## Slot Machine

Slot machine booklets (and thus the panes) are the only sources for many catalog-listed stamps, including several major numbers. The booklets were often produced in lower quantities than even commemorative stamp issues; often the panes (and stamps from them) are much scarcer than other stamp issues of the time period. Unfortunately, the Scott Catalog has failed to reflect this reality.
If you are seeking complete booklets, generally speaking (but not always) the same prices will apply (for NH) for the least costly applicable HA number and/or the least costly type within the respective HA number. However, please be aware that some complete booklets contain TWO panes. In other cases (most notably Scott \#462a) a pane can come from different booklets (Scott \#462a comes from Facit \#Ha6 OR Ha7 OR Ha8) of significantly different value. The pane price is related to the least costly booklet. If you are seeking complete booklets, please be sure to add a note specifying this.

Of the edition numbers, 1 and 11 seem to be scarcer. R vs I panes seem to be roughly equal, however, perfed (x) margins seem to be a little more common than imperf ( y ) margins. There are many combinations that I have either never seen or have only seen one example.

## Mourning Stamps

The Finnish "Mourning Stamp" is actually a privately produced label without franking value. It had a purchase price of 1 penni, and " 1 PENNI." is printed on the backside. It was designed by the famous Finnish artist Akseli Gallén (Gallen-Kallela) and used in protest of the Russification of Finnish stamp designs. Starting 14 August 1900,
the previous Finnish stamp designs could no longer be used on mail sent abroad; instead Russian design stamps had to be used. (Previously on 1 January 1892 Finnish design stamps had been banned from mail addresssed to Russia.) On 14 January 1901, Finnish design stamps were banned from domestic mail use, completing the Russification of stamp designs.

Mourning Stamps were intended to be placed next to the postage stamp as a protest, but were quickly banned. Domestic mail bearing them is rare. However, in coastal areas, letters bearing Mourning Stamps were placed in the mail boxes of ships heading abroad; such covers were canceled upon arrival at the next (foreign) port of call, usually Stockholm, Sweden. Such covers are scarce. Used singles of Mourning stamps with readable town and date are very desirable, though it is usually very difficult to read the cancellation due to being black on black.
There were several printings of the Mourning Stamps resulting in visibly different types, though some printings are difficult to distinguish. I am not aware of any published detailed cataloging of the printings / types beyond what is listed in Facit (please let me know if you have further information). In some cases, the difference in printings can be seen in the size of the printed sheet or the appearance of sheet margin examples. Facit pictures two types which differ in the shade of the " 1 " on the backside. The Facit Type 1 has a long curved serif that becomes almost horiztontal. The Facit Type 2 has a short, straighter serif that mostly points down. Most of the Type 1 stamps I have seen have shiny black ink. Most of the Type 2 stamps I have seen have very dull, sometimes grayish, black ink. In my experience, the Type 2 stamps are much scarcer. Large multiples are scarce as are singles or multiples with margin attached (which can help to separate prinitngs).

## Forgeries

## Second Issue

The North Ingermanland forgeries or fakes that I have observed were philatelically created many years ago. Originally, the intent of the forger was probably to create "packet material" from a small country whose stamps were hard to obtain; the intent was certainly not to defraud the post office. Years ago the forgeries sold for low prices, not really in an attempt to cheat collectors, but to give an "opportunity" to have stamps from this small country. However, the real stamps are now more costly and the forgeries are of high enough quality to be "dangerous" to those collectors who do not have the real stamps for comparison.

The forgeries exist on yellowish or extremely white paper. According to the Finnish forgeries manual (available from me), the yellowish paper forgeries were printed in sheets of $10 \times 10$ and the extremely white paper forgeries in sheets of $5 \times 5$. However, I have seen $5 \times 5$ sheets that I consider to be yellowish paper, thus the subject needs fur-
ther research. In general, all can be identified by a) whiter paper; b) brighter ink colors; c) usually obvious brush marks in the gum; and d) often rough perforations (not a defect; the originals do have rough perforations too). Imperforates, missing centers, inverted centers, and other types of errors also exist (all usually never having been gummed), but are seldom seen on the market.

Scott numbers have been used unless otherwise indicated. All items are available for viewing on approval.

When gummed, the gum was roughly applied by brush. I use the condition "NH" for stamps that do not show any sign of ever having been hinged (whether gummed or ungummed), even if a gummed stamp shows gum disturbance due to the conditions of manufacture.

## Scandinavia

## Tourist Issues

These stamps were issued in cooperation with the Swedish and other Scandinavian post offices and are valid FROM other countries TO Sweden, Denmark, Norway, Finland, and Åland. They are listed by the Facit catalog. There were five different stamp issues included in six different issues of booklets.

It all started in 1994 in the Canary Islands, off the coast of Spain. Many Scandinavians vacation in the Canary Islands during the dark Scandinavian winters. Unfortunately, sending an airmail letter from the Canary Islands back to friends in the Scandinavian countries used to take several weeks as it crawled through the Spanish mails. To solve this problem, Sweden Post, through a cooperative arrangement, issued special stamps, initially sold only in the Canary Islands. These stamps had international franking value for post cards (one stamp) and letters (two stamps) to
Sweden, Denmark, Norway, Finland, and Åland. The following year, the availability of stamps and service was expanded to other tourist destinations such as Cyprus and Crete. Eventually the stamps came to be used from a number of areas, including Florida! The letters and post cards are posted with the hotels and travel agents and are carried aboard charter airliners to Stockholm where they are placed in the regular mails for delivery within Sweden or to the other countries.
This mail service ceased in the fall of 1998. The stamps have already become quite hard to find; prices are already rising. However, most collectors are not yet aware of them; as they become more well known, we can expect prices to climb.

To my knowledge, this is a completely new type of stamp: Issued by one country for postage use on letters from a different country, back to the home country (or to a neighboring country). These special-purpose stamps are not local issues because they have international validity and they were authorized by a national postal service.
They are stamps. The items below are listed by Facit numbers.

## Stamps

The Facit Catalog has already listed these stamps. European catalog and album publishers are likely to eventually include them as well.
They are already being included in the Stender Albums. Obtain your stamps now before they are listed in all catalogs; before prices go up further! Though these stamps were printed in Sweden, they are valid for mail to Denmark, Norway, Finland, and Åland as well as Sweden. This means that collectors of all these countries are including them in their collections. You may wish to do so as well.

## Covers

The Tourist Stamps were applied to post cards (one stamp) and letters/envelopes (two stamps) by the sender or perhaps a travel agency or hotel employee at the tourism location (i.e. Canary Islands, etc.). The mail was then privately transported to the nearest airport served by related Scandinavian airlines or charter airlines serving the tourists. The airlines carried the mail to Stockholm where it was sorted for delivery in Sweden or carriage on to one of the other Scandinavian countries.

The card and envelopes were not normally postmarked in accordance with Swedish post office practice regarding mail that is imprinted or bears stamps bearing the statement "porto betalt" or "port payé". Postmarked covers and cards are the exception and are, of course, avidly sought after.
